



Policy Title:	Permit fee reduction or waiver policy
Approved:	December 2014 amended June 2015
Summary:	The policy outlines how the Combat Sports Authority will handle requests for waiving or reducing fees payable under the <i>Combat Sports Regulation 2014</i> for registrations and permits.
Policy Statement:	The policy details when a request for waiving or reducing a fee payable will be considered by the CSA.
Applicability:	Persons seeking a waiver or reduction in registration or permit fees.
Procedure:	<p>Any requests for consideration must be made in writing to the CSA, clearly outlining the reason for the request. The request must include the mitigating circumstances that apply to the situation.</p> <p>The CSA will consider genuine hardship cases in relation to registration fees. This consideration will not extend to the fee payable to Police for their Security Determination for Promoters, Managers and Match-makers.</p> <p>Promoters seeking a reduction or waiver of a permit fee must provide reasons as to why the ticket price cannot be increased to cover the fee cost of the permit.</p> <p>The CSA as a general principle will, when a professional exhibition bout or display is to be included on what is otherwise an all amateur show being held for charitable purposes, reduce the permit application fee to that applicable to an amateur only contest. A request for consideration of a fee reduction must still be made to the CSA in such a circumstance.</p>
Check types:	Requests will be considered on their merit. Other information may be requested by the CSA.
